Sunday school was held at Dennis Hall and my teachers were Miss Mildred Wodkowski (now Mrs. Millie Youmans, a senior in the Myrrbearing Woman's Group) and the late Mrs. Ann Telep. Mary Ann Harvilla and Gregory Joseph Harvilla were my classmates. I remember Mrs. Telep asked me to recite the names of the twelve Apostles. Gregory Harvilla pulled on my pigtails. Mary Ann helped her mother, the late Teresa Harvilla, prepare "coffee hour"! My church school report card said "S" for satisfactory, and "US" for attendance (unsatisfactory). Oh well. I remember in church one Sunday, I fainted. I felt hungry and the beautiful fragrance of incense was heavy. The late Mr Hurchik, took me outside and waved some kind of menthol at my nose and I woke up. He was always there with his daughter Nancy Hurchik who is now Doctor Nancy Munaco.
