**PRESANCTIFIED GIFTS LITURGY**

During Great Lent we do not celebrate the Divine Liturgy on weekdays, except for the Holy Feast Day of the *Annunciation of the Theotokos on Wednesday, March 25<sup>th</sup>*. This is because the Divine Liturgy is a joyous celebration and great Lent is a time for repentance of our sins. So that the faithful are not left without Holy Communion, the Presanctified Liturgy is usually celebrated on Wednesday and/or Friday. “Presanctified” means “already consecrated” because the bread and wine (Body and Blood of Jesus Christ) of Holy Communion were consecrated on the preceding Sunday. The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts will be served on Wednesday of each week during Great Lent at 6:00 PM (except the Wednesday of Holy Week). Fasting before the Liturgy should start at 12:00 Noon (6 hours before receiving the Holy Sacrament). Confessions will be heard before Liturgy, or after, or by appointment.

**FASTING AND RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION AT PRESANCTIFIED LITURGY:** If you would like to take communion at the Presanctified Liturgy during Great Lent, you must fast by taking no food from 12:00 noon until you receive Holy Communion. Confession must be taken before Liturgy. If you have taken private confession or General Confession during a given month, or 4 weeks, then you may receive Absolution at the Presanctified Liturgy and Sunday Liturgies in that four (4) week period. We pray that many of our members will partake of Holy Communion more than once during Great Lent!
